To the extent that people today can be inspired by being in an environment where exceptional American historical legal figures have been, Chief Justice John Marshall's Oak Hill has been chosen to become the nucleus of the American Law Memorial.

Oak Hill: Oak Hill was established in 1773 by the family of the Great Chief Justice John Marshall. It is on both the Virginia and the National Register of Historic Places. Oak Hill is a "Through Hallowed Ground" historic site located next to Route 66 in rural Fauquier County 52 miles from downtown Washington DC.


